

and linked to Shimla by the UNESCO-listed Kalka–Shimla Toy Train. Shimla is also easily accessible by road from Delhi (350 km) and Chandigarh (115 km) through regular Volvo, HRTC bus, and taxi services.

Note: Connectivity from Delhi to Shimla is best, with Himachal Roadways buses providing direct service (<https://online.hrtchp.com>). However, from cities like Karnal, Ambala, Chandigarh, and Kalka, bus connectivity is available, but Volvo services may not be.

Accommodation

Participants are therefore advised to make their own accommodation arrangements by booking hotels of their choice well in advance to avoid inconvenience and secure better rates. The symposium is expected to foster scientific collaboration and generate actionable strategies to promote resilient agricultural systems, ensure food security, and advance sustainable agriculture.

About ICAR IARI Regional Station, Shimla

The ICAR-Indian Agricultural Research Institute Regional Station was established in its present form on 1 April 2005 through the merger of the Cereals Breeding Centre, Tutikandi, and the Horticultural Crops Research Centre, Dhanda, with administrative and laboratory facilities located at Amartara Campus. The cereal research programme, initiated in 1935 under the leadership of Kailas Chandra Mehta and Benjamin Peary Pal, has made significant contributions to wheat and barley improvement for the North-Western Himalayan region. The station has developed 19 wheat and 9 barley varieties for commercial cultivation, besides registering 24 genetic stocks possessing valuable agronomic traits. The horticultural research programme, established on 19 October 1965, focuses on the collection, conservation, and evaluation of temperate fruit germplasm. The station has developed two apple varieties, one apple rootstock, one walnut variety, and one stone-fruit rootstock. It has also contributed significantly to integrated disease management strategies for cereals and temperate fruits, emphasizing disease diagnosis and precise pathogen identification. The station continues to support sustainable agriculture in the Northern Hill Region through research, innovation, and technology dissemination.

Themes for Technical Sessions

Rapid climate change, emerging and re-emerging plant diseases, declining soil health, evolving pathogen populations, and increasing demand for safe and sustainable food production have created new challenges for global agriculture. Recent advances in genomics, artificial intelligence, digital agriculture, microbiome research, and eco-friendly crop protection strategies are transforming the field of plant health management. In this context, the conference on “Next-Generation Plant Health Strategies for Climate Resilience, Food Security and Sustainable Agriculture” aims to provide a multidisciplinary platform for researchers, academicians, industry professionals, policymakers, extension workers, and farmers to deliberate on innovative and sustainable approaches for safeguarding crop health, improving agricultural productivity, and strengthening climate-resilient farming systems.
